

## Eleventh Danish International Economics Workshop

### Call for Papers

Aarhus, April 16<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup>, 2015

We hereby invite papers for the **Eleventh Danish International Economics Workshop** to be held in Aarhus, April 16<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup>, 2015. The workshop will be hosted by *The Tuborg Research Centre for Globalization and Firms*, [www.tgf.au.dk](http://www.tgf.au.dk).

For 2015 we are pleased to have Professor Peter Neary to join and present the keynote paper as well as to comment on the other papers presented at the workshop.

**Peter Neary** is Professor of Economics at Oxford University and a Professorial Fellow of Merton College. He has also held full-time positions at Trinity College Dublin and at University College Dublin where he was Professor of Political Economy from 1980 to 2006. He is currently on full-time research leave, funded by an Advanced Grant from the European Research Council. His main research field is international trade theory, where he has worked on short- to long-run adjustment, the economics of resource-rich economies (especially the "Dutch Disease"), trade and industrial policy, and the implications of imperfect competition (especially oligopoly) for trade and globalisation, among other topics. He has also written on consumer theory (including rationing and index numbers), industrial organisation (including the economics of research and development), and macroeconomics (including international macro theory and Irish economic policy).

The aim of the workshop is to bring together researchers working on issues in international economics from all Danish research institutions, as well as to provide a forum for meeting international scholars from leading foreign research institutions. As in the previous years, we hope again this year to have a number of non-Danish researchers to participate. Focus will be on scientific exchange, facilitating collaborative research and contacts among researchers, to offer PhD students and junior researchers an opportunity to present their work and to establish closer contacts among Danish and international researchers in the International Economics field.

Papers (or extended abstracts) should be **submitted electronically by February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015** to Susan Stilling ([sti@econ.au.dk](mailto:sti@econ.au.dk)) in pdf format only. A preliminary version of the program will be sent out by February 15<sup>th</sup>. The only requirement in terms of topics is that papers should have at least one JEL code of category F.

Scholars who are interested in participating without a paper of their own are most welcome, please indicate your intention by e-mail. The core program of the workshop will run from Thursday April 16<sup>th</sup> lunch time until Friday April 17<sup>th</sup> late afternoon.
